Paid Apprenticeships to Study Visual Perception

- Up to two positions are available on a competitive basis.
- The positions are sponsored by the U.S. Army Educational Outreach Program (USAEP). The apprenticeships are open to both high school students and undergraduates. For additional information, please visit www.usaeop.com.
- The apprentices will carry out research on human visual perception in the laboratory of Dr. Jay Hegdé at the Georgia Health Sciences University, in Augusta, GA. For additional information about our research, please visit www.hegde.us.
- The apprentices will have an opportunity to carry out hands-on research and to learn cutting-edge research methods, including functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI).
- Each apprentice will be paid by the Army at a rate of up to \$10/hour for a total 300 hours of research work. The research can be carried out on a full-time basis during the summer of 2012 or on a part-time basis during the 2012-2013 academic year, subject to Dr. Hegdé's approval.
